Thermal imaging cameras help identify areas of heat loss on buildings. This can really help owners target the interventions and investments that they need to put in place to make their homes more cost effective to heat.

We are hoping to to provide a service where members' homes are surveyed using the camera. **Johnson Matthey** are hoping to have volunteers trained up to help with the camera and its findings.

Hedgehog Highways

Many of our gardens make ideal hedgehog habitats, but hedgehogs' access to them is limited by the artificial boundaries imposed by fences and other hard borders.

To make it easier for them to move around, consider making a small hole in or under you fences. It only needs to be 13cm by 13cm wide.

If you are replacing fencing or have neighbours who might be, please encourage them to put in these much needed gaps.

REG has written to the planning authority to ask them to make the provision of these



holes a condition of granting planning permission for future developments.

We have joined Hedgehog Street's fencing campaign and we are writing to fencing companies and landscapers to encourage them to provide and install hedgehog friendly fencing.
